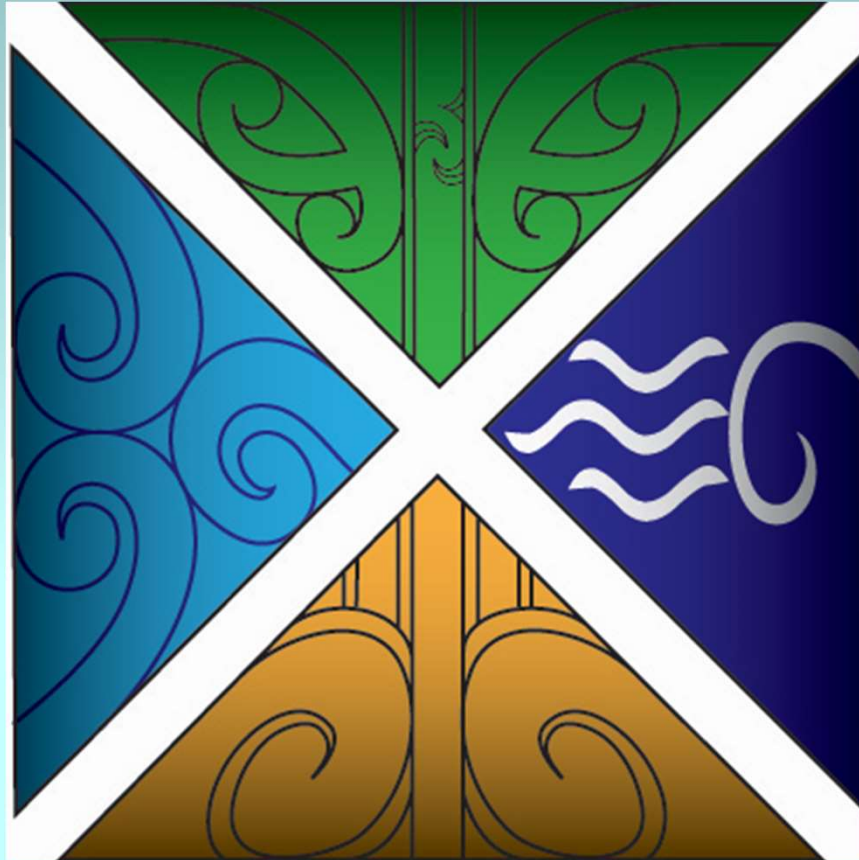

Our tipuna Hikawera II fed a starving group of stragglers by killing 70 pairs of their much loved dogs in order for the group to survive. The offal from the feast was washed in the river we know as Tūtaekurī today. Generosity and hospitality for others was upmost.

2. Where we have come from to get to where we want to be

- Kaitiakitanga from the four hapū over Tūtaekurī Awa for more than 600 years
- Mana whenua affirmed through whakapapa and current landowners
- Mana Whenua discussions concluded the degradation of Mauri over generations
- The need for the active involvement around the decision making, management and enhancement of our taonga tuku iho
- Ngā Hapū o Tūtaekurī aims to reverse this trend
- This plan was critiqued and mandated at hui ā hapū in 2014.

Mauri

Papatūānuku – sediment control, gravel extraction, sustainable land Management, Wetlands (retain water)



Tāne mahuta - native planting and restoration areas, riparian planting, wetlands for filtration of pollutants and habitat, native planting proliferation, enhanced biodiversity growth

Tangaroa- water quality, water quantity, water take, mahinga kai proliferation
