MEMORANDUM 2 TO PARTICPANTS

Supplementary s42A Officer's Report

26 October 2022

INTRODUCTION

- This memorandum outlines why we have asked the Regional Council's Reporting Officer, Mr Paul Barrett, whether he would like to prepare a supplementary s42A RMA Officer's Report, which he has agreed would be helpful.
- The hearing will take place in the week starting 14 November 2022. The Commissioners will undertake a site visit on Monday 14 November. The hearing will commence in Ahuriri on 15

November, with the second day (Wednesday 16) in Waipawa. The hearing will reconvene in Ahuriri on the 17th and, if necessary, 18th November.

3 All parties to the hearing will be advised of the exact timetabling and venues by 31 October 2022.

PROGRESS TO DATE

- Parties will recollect that the hearing was originally set down for the week starting 29 August 2022, but was deferred until November at the applicants' request. In accordance with the original timetable the Council Officer's s42A Report was circulated on 8 August 2022. It was accompanied by four supplementary reports prepared by experts from the consultancy Pattle Delamore Partners (PDP). These addressed potential effects of the applications including: those of the groundwater takes, such as on well interference; those on surface water quality and quantity and associated effects on stream ecology; and those of land use change, such as on groundwater quality. Significant concerns were also raised about the reliability of the applicants' groundwater modelling.
- In our first memorandum dated 22 September 2022 we directed that expert conferencing take place between representatives of the applicant, and the experts from PDP who had prepared supplementary reports.
- Three such expert conferences have now been held, and their results have been reported via Joint Witness Statements. They were on:
 - a. Groundwater modelling, where there was full agreement that the updated model prepared by Aqualinc Consulting for the Applicant was fit for purpose. This means we can rely on the outputs of the model to assess the effects of the applications on the Ruataniwha groundwater resource.
 - b. The effects of the applications on surface water ecology. Here there was some agreement between the experts, but certainly not full agreement as uncertainties still exist. Importantly, it was agreed that the applications would not adversely affect any "natural wetlands".
 - c. The effects of the applications on potential interference with other bores close to the proposed points of groundwater take. Again, some agreement was reached, but several issues remain in dispute.

UPDATED OFFICER'S REPORT

7 In his original s42A report Mr Barrett had relied on the expert assessments from PDP. Given

the extent of agreement in the Joint Witness Statements, parts of those assessments prepared

in early August no longer stand. Given this, we thought it appropriate to ask Mr Barrett if he

wanted the opportunity to provide a short supplementary officer's report, which he agreed

would be helpful. We contacted the applicants' legal counsel, Mr Bal Matheson, and he

supported our suggestion.

8 Mr Barrett is busy, and has asked that his supplementary report be prepared and circulated

no later than midday on Friday 4 November 2022. He has told us he will try to do it earlier if

possible. What it contains, and what if any changes are made to his recommendations, are

entirely up to him.
