1. Introduction

- 1.1 Huiarau, Panekiri, Matakuhia and Whakapuanaki – Sacred Mountains I call “Mountain Home”
¹Waikaremoana, Waikareiti, Waikare taheke, Ruakituri and Hopupu Honengenenge Matangi Rau – (My rivers) Pure waters from Heavenly Father, entrenched to form passages of veins flowing earthward, nourishing, cleansing and frolicking with us, his children below.
 Te Moananui a Kiwa – (The Ocean). Te Moananui a Kiwa and Hopupu Honengenenge Matangi Rau regularly meet twice daily near “The Heads” at Rangi-houa, Te Wairoa.
 ‘The Heads’ Rangi-houa – The Whenua. Footprints of my whanau remain entrenched within and on the land today.
 Ko Te Kopua a HineWaimako – Whanau Urupa – Earthly resting place of whanau, most who didn’t make it back to their “Mountain Home”
 Ko The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints Wairoa Ward - Te Whanau

1.2 HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) LTD is the Parent Company for whanau Suburban Sections 830 & 831 Ahu Whenua Trust. Suburban Sections 830 & 831 Class 1 Township of Clyde are two remaining blocks of whanau lands which has not been acquired by enforcement of The Public Works Act 1908 or otherwise. ²Located at the corners of Fitzroy Street and Kopu Road Wairoa, the area of land is fondly referred to as 'The Heads'.

1.3 Ms Ina Kara France was contracted as Project Manager ³in June 2019 by myself, Executive Director of HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) LTD, the Parent Company for the RANGI-HOUA MĀORI LAND OWNERS OF Suburban Sections 830 and 831 Kopu Road, Wairoa.

I worked with Ina who developed a Proposal and Feasibility Study that would research the potential possibilities of developing Suburban Sections 830 & 831 properties into an educational / commercial venture.

The venture would enable employment for HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) LTD shareholders to support to engage employment for the wider Wairoa Community within the Cultural Tourism and Outdoor Pursuits Industries.

This venture intention included Accommodation, Café, Art Gallery and Retail within a Marae setting. This intention was supported in writing by the Mayor of Wairoa and the Wairoa District Council.

Due to the Pre-Hearing and pending Hearing discussions, regards Treated and Untreated Wastewater Discharge into The Wairoa River, the research into proposed venture is on hold.

Such wastewater discharge into the Wairoa River adversely impacts on the venture, a barrier to entry and to participate fully' in the Cultural Tourism and Outdoor Pursuits Industries.

3. Executive Summary

3.1 The Statement of Evidence seeks a decision from the Independent Hearing Commissioners to decline the Wairoa District Council Resource Consent application based on the enclosed evidence.

3.2 There are five fundamental recommendations as follows:

- a) No Discharge of Treated and Untreated Wastewater into Te Wairoa Hopupu Honengenenge Matangi Rau (The Wairoa River);⁴
- b) Financial Compensation to HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) LTD for discomfort and distress caused for over 20 years;
- c) Ensure The Wairoa River is of drinkable quality;
- d) Ensure The Wairoa River has safe and healthy swimming areas;
- e) The Mauri be restored.

3.3 Te Wairoa Hopupu Honengenenge Matangi Rau (The Wairoa River) will always be of significant Cultural Value to not only past, current and future owners of Suburban Sections 830 & 831 and surrounding lands, but also to the wider Community o Te Wairoa)⁵

5 Mauri

- 5.1 Te Wairoa Hopupu Honengenenge Matangi Rau (The Wairoa River) is a taonga. Kaitiakitanga are the people
- “If the wellbeing of a taonga is well
- The wellbeing of the people will be well”
- 5.2 My mother Juliana Marsh was raised at ‘The Heads’ by her grandparents Martha and Heremia Maehe aka Jerry Marsh.
- 5.3 Mum recalled at around the age of 5yrs, her grandpa Heremia travelled to Te Wairarapa and retrieved her from the household of her paternal father Hakaraia Haretiera Witinitara and his sister in law Amiria McRoberts.³¹
- 5.4 Word may have got back to Heremia that his moko was enjoying the taste and aroma of coffee, remnants after her Grand aunt Amiria had entertained her many distinguished whanau from home (Te Wairoa and Te Kaha) on their way to and from Parliament.³²
- 5.5 We can only conjecture, Heremia adhering to his gospel beliefs may have disagreed with the environment his firstborn moko was being exposed to.

- 5.6 Church records show us that Heremia was baptised and confirmed a member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints by David Lindsay and H B Jensen respectively on 16 May 1897.³³ Martha was baptised and confirmed likewise 12 years later.
- 5.7 Previous to his conversion to The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, Heremia and his whanau were devout followers of the Ringatu Hahi.
- 5.8 A number of whanau were baptised on 26 January 1913 in the Wairoa River at 'The Heads' by G A Chadwick and confirmed respectively by Heremia himself.³⁴ Heremia's aging mother in law (Erana McRoberts) was then living with her daughter Martha and Heremia. Being 84 years young, it was fortuitous she did not have to journey far that day for her own baptism.³⁵
- 5.9 It is common knowledge amongst us whanau, 'The Heads' (Rangi-Houa) is deemed to be consecrated land. We understand the land to be blessed, is sacred and spiritual to whanau and is to be respected and preserved to provide health and wellbeing to others.

6 Maori Cultural Values

6.1 Cultural

- a) It is accepted that baptisms were previously performed in the now stagnant pond below Hine-te-ra o Putahi (Paeroa 2E2A3) often referred to as 'The Marsh's Marae' on the Mangapoike Road, Frasertown.
- b) The Kauhauroa Stream that flowed through Hine-te-ra o Putahi separated the Papakainga from the whanau urupa. The Kauhauroa Stream once provided plenty of kai to the Ngati Hine-te-ra o Putahi.
- c) For today mana-a-rohe for Ngati Hine-te-ra equates to a few acres of marae reservation carrying the name Putahi, since cut in two by a Public Works roadway under which the bones of former occupants still lay.
- d) Minutes in te reo maori of the church services held in the 'Hine-te-ra Whare o Karakia'³⁶ dated 5th Mei 1929 through July 3 1932 identifies numerous whanau recorded as being in attendance at various church services.³⁷
- e) Human haste for roadway progress it seems has impacted on the health and well being of waterways and surrounding lands at 'Hine-te-ra o Putahi' evident as today, not one person occupies Hine-te-ra o Putahi.

- f) The River provides whanau water to bathe with, water to drink from the water edge, having flowed through the many running streams and creeks before entering the river, the river provided food for whanau, such as watercress, tuna, whitebait, koura, flounders, kahawai and much much more.
- g) The River also provided entertainment but essentially she (the Wairoa river) was sacred, and pure and we all paid respect to her, as she provided same to us.
- h) We as children knew which areas of the River and her tributaries to gather food, swim or bathe. We never ever soiled the river in any way. Those who were menstruating were not to enter the water - period.

6.2 Landscape / 'The Gardens'

- a) I recall the times we as whanau, church members and practically all our neighbours along McLean and Apatu Streets would bike down to 'The Heads' to work in 'The Gardens'.
- b) The neighbours at 'The Heads' were our Robinson whanau and they would join us as well. That would have been around 1964.
- c) The whare were no longer, but the humungus as trees that aligned the side fenceline provided much sought out shelter from the heat of the sun.
- d) A flowing Creek was running through the length of both properties, and I recall wading carefully through it so as not to disturb the ducklings as I joined in a game of hide and seek in the corn field on the other side.
- e) Beyond the cornfield towards the foot of the hill (today's unformed McLean St) lay the watermelon patch.
The Brethertons were living in the whare up the hill.
- f) Before having fun though, it was 'head down' and 'bums up'. Dad would be plowing up a row of turf for us to either plant or gather potato, kumara, kamo kamo, pumpkin and watermelon.³⁸
- g) This was usually Spring / Summer time as we would afterwards all enjoy lambtails, fish and tuna freshly caught, potatoes, sweetcorn all cooked (or not) over an open fire across the road on the beach.
- h) Yes! In the 1960's we were afforded a beautiful sandy beach at the frontage of Suburban Sections 830 & 831 Class 1 Township of Clyde. Vegetation was prolific along the riverbank.
- i) Pickings from 'The Garden' was dropped off to whanau on our way home. Dad and my brothers set out further afield to deliver same. 'The Heads' provided food for the whole community.

6.3 Landscape

- a) I cherish the conversations my mother shared regards her life experiences at 'The Heads'
- b) I had graduated at Napier Hospital in 1978 and was now home nursing at The Wairoa Hospital.³⁹ I would mention elderly patients who were in hospital. Mum knew every-one and they likewise her. I recall sharing with mum, a conversation had with the late Eric Powdrell and he expressing how he "admired Grandpa Jeremiah".
- c) Mum related that as a young girl she would help her brother Oliver (actually her Uncle) move their cows that were grazing at 'Tawhara' down to the flats at Huramua. When questioned, "How come the cows are on Powdrell land?" Her simple response was, "those lands were once ours, they're whanau (Powdrells) who came into the area, they had no land, grandpa had plenty so he gave them some".

That confirmed what Mr Eric Powdrell had shared with myself. It seems Grandpa Heremia was a very generous man.
- d) Many hours were spent with my mother as she endured progressive senile dementia. She would wander back into her childhood, and often this was when she shared some of her childhood memories. Some good, and others not.
- e) I got to see through her eyes, the expanse of whanau land then, compared to what there is today. Stories of the current site of the Wairoa Wastewater Treatment Plant is interesting to say the least, as is the acquisition of land to build the Wairoa Brickworks as well as the materials required to produce the end product.
- f) The Harbour Board Works were another of human handiwork in impacting on the health and well being of The Wairoa River and surrounding lands at 'The Heads'.

7. Conclusion

- 7.1 Grandpa Heremia's faith in the gospel is testament to adversaries endured, in 1915 he sacrificed his firstborn 10-year-old son, Richard Te Popo Maehe Marsh (Dick), to be adopted and raised in the USA by Edwin Dee Olpin, his wife Inez Robison and their children.
- 7.2 Dick left New Zealand in the company of Elder Lewis Olpin as Lewis returned home having served his mission in NZ.⁴⁰ Dick was legally adopted by the Olpin family and it was accepted his whanau may never see him again in their lifetime.
- 7.3 Fortuitously, Richard later returned to NZ around 1926 to serve a three-year mission as a Mormon Elder. Upon his release in 1929, the opportunity arose to be released in New Zealand rather the USA, and on 11 May 1931 Uncle Dick married Pare Kingi of Tahoraiti Dannevirke.
At one time Uncle Dick and Aunt Polly occupied one of the whare at "The Heads".
- 7.4 Whakapapa identifies one's connection to the land at a particular period of time.
I am proud to be of Irish, Scottish, Polish, English and Maori descent.
That's the mixture of blood that runs through my veins.
I have had no say with how that looks!
- 7.5 I feel blessed, honoured and humbled to stand before you all today and share but only snippets of my closest loved one's experiences at "The Heads" Rangi-houa.
- 7.6 Hawkes Bay Regional Council advised per letter dated 24 September 2020 that a hearing for resource consent APP-123774 will be held today 30 November 2020 at the Wairoa War Memorial Hall and is likely to proceed over 2 days.

- 7.7 HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) LTD have a number of concerns they wish Wairoa District Council to address with them face to face; they are as follows -
- a) Wairoa District Council has failed to engage or communicate directly with HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) regards wastewater discharged at their front door.
 - b) Wairoa District Council has failed to engage or communicate directly with HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) regards outlet structure/s at their front, side and back doors.
 - c) HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) LTD would deem it offensive to be advised, they may wish not to bathe, swim, fish or gather food from the Wairoa River at any given time, due to wastewater discharge/s.
 - d) Wairoa District Council has failed to acknowledge HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) LTD as a significant 'stakeholder' regards ongoing structure/s of utilites along Fitroy Street and McLean Street.
 - e) Before HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) LTD seeks Legal Advice regards pending discussions with The Crown re: unformed McLean and Apatu Streets and the ancestral lands acquired through enforcement of The Public Works Act 1908, they welcome engagement with WDC to discuss same.
 - f) HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) LTD insist The Mauri is restored, and are confident same is achievable through discussions directly with WDC & HBRC.

Given, the above concerns are yet to be addressed, HOPE O TE WAIROA (RWT) LTD oppose the current 'application for consent' for Wairoa District Council Wastewater Discharge into The Wairoa River

Vote: In favour of resolution - 3 Hapu representatives for motion

In favour: - Ngati Moewhare, Ngai Te Mao and Ngai Te Kapuamatatoru

Abstained: - Ngai Taura/(Tanemitirangi).

The process undertaken was in accordance with customary hui and practice where all in attendance were invited to participate in frank and open dialogue. The adoption of a quasi-tikanga rule of thumb ensured due process was followed in accordance with the Te Tira Whakaemi o Te Wairoa Deed of Mandate and in particular rule 9.7 Removal and Replacement of Mandated Representatives of Te Tira Whakaemi o Te Wairoa and sub-rule 9.7.1 and 9.7.2 and all relevant points therein noted.

Insofar as due diligence and adherence to process was concerned; an observer and four (4) mandated Cluster 2 representatives of Te Tira Whakaemi o Te Wairoa were also in attendance where it was noted that internal breaches of the rules of the TTWOTW Deed of Mandate had already occurred and was cause for confusion as to the current status and position of Esther Foster as this had in part been done in closed Te Tira Whakaemi forum 29 August 2014.

Of the hapuu representatives in attendance only one abstained from the voting process and the rest unanimously voted in favour of the afore motion which was duly passed for action by letter informing the Chair of Te Tira Whakaemi o Te Wairoa (Te Tira) of the decision made and the process undertaken leading up to that decision.

Those in attendance are of one mind that this issue must end, as the reasons formally outlined for the removal of Esther Foster as Mandated Rep of Te Wairoa Tapokorau Cluster 2 were without substance or validity, therefore back to status quo, the 3 recognised mandated Cluster 2 representatives of Te Tira Whakaemi o Te Wairoa are Wikitoria Hauraki, Esther Foster and Phillip Beattie with one (1) position to formally fill due to the resignation of the former mandated rep.

It is the inherent obligation of Te Kapuamatatoru hapu mandated representative Esther Foster to ensure both our and other hapu interests are best represented within Te Tira.

It is deemed necessary to write this letter to ensure transparency and honesty is upheld, ensuring Te Tira is informed of the outcome of the Te Wairoa Tapokorau Cluster 2 Hui held Saturday 30 August 2014 at Tawhiti a Maru Marae. We trust that Wiki Hauraki will meet her obligations as the Interim Chair, to formally advise Te Tira Whakaemi o Te Wairoa of the outcome of this meeting (30 August 2014) in regards Agenda item number "1. Matters from Hui -- Removal of Esther Foster".
