You may carry out works as a Permitted Activity subject to:

- giving written notice (Clause 8(1));
- providing the information set out in Clause 8(3);
- meeting the requirements set out the Schedule;
- Keeping records of works as required by Clause 13.

Have you given written notice 20 working days prior to commencement?

You must give written notice to HBRC of your proposal at least 20 days prior to commencement

You have not met the Permitted Activity Conditions and may not proceed .

Within the 20 day period has a Council advised that 1 or more requirements of the Schedule appear unlikely to be met and requested further information?

You may proceed with the works as they were proposed in your notice after 20 working days from providing your notice to Council.

You may proceed with the works as they were proposed in your notice and the further information 15 working days after providing the further information unless a Council notifies you that they are not still satisfied that the requirements of the Schedule will be met.

You may not commence any rural recovery works that would normally require a resource consent
